



APPLY FOR UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSION INTERNATIONAL STUDENT CHECKLIST

Follow the steps in this checklist to complete your application for undergraduate admission.

- Determine your status.** If you will need UNLV to issue the U.S. Immigration Form I-20 for you to enter or remain in the U.S. with F-1 visa status, you should apply using the international student application. All other students should apply using the domestic student application.
- Apply online at unlv.edu/admissions/international.** Review the application deadlines listed on the bottom in the black box. You will be charged a nonrefundable \$95 application fee.
- Submit your transcripts.** If you have less than one year of tertiary education (college/university level), you must submit both your official secondary school and official tertiary school transcripts of all institutions attended. Additionally, each non-English tertiary level education (college/university) transcript must be translated and evaluated by a NACES member organization at the applicant's expense and be submitted to the UNLV Office of Admission. See www.naces.org for a listing. The official transcripts must be received by the UNLV Office of Admission prior to deadline, in a sealed envelope from the school or appropriate examination board.

If you are transferring from another U.S. school, please submit a copy of your passport visa page, I-94 departure record, and the Form I-20 from the school you are currently attending in the U.S.

- Submit proof of English proficiency.** Submit proof of English proficiency. See unlv.edu/admissions/international-requirements.html for details.
- Submit a financial certification and bank letter.** Complete the Confidential Financial Certification Form, signed by the student or guarantor, which can be found with the international student application. Include with the form a bank letter showing an amount equal to or greater than the sum found on the Confidential Financial Certification Form. (See reverse side for information on the cost of tuition.)
- Submit immunization records.** The state of Nevada requires all students to submit proof of having had the following vaccinations:
 - Two doses of measles, mumps, rubella (MMR)
 - One dose of tetanus diphtheria (TD) within the past 10 years
 - Students 23 years or age and younger are required to present proof of a meningitis (*Neisseria meningitidis*) vaccination in order to reside in campus housing.

Fax or mail a copy of your records to the Office of Admissions (with English translation if necessary). Include your name and e-mail address.

DEADLINES

Your application for admission, \$95 fee, and all supporting documents listed in the checklist must be received by the Office of Admissions by the deadline listed for your desired semester. Please note: Deadlines may vary depending on where you currently live.

If you are already in F-1 visa status and will transfer your I-20 to UNLV:

Spring 2011: Dec. 31

Fall 2011: Aug. 12

If you require a new U.S. Immigration Form I-20 to request an F-1 student visa at a U.S. Consulate visa-issuing office:

Spring 2011: Nov. 19

Fall 2011: July 8

AFTER YOU APPLY FOR **ADMISSION** INTERNATIONAL STUDENT CHECKLIST

1. **Check your application status.**

Visit unlv.edu/admissions/app-status.html or call 702-774-8658 to check on your application status.

2. **Review the required expenses.** Estimated expenses for the 2010-2011 academic year include tuition/fees and minimum living expenses. There are additional expenses for dependents in the United States. All fees are subject to change without notice. You must supply a bank letter showing the total amount or more. For academic year 2011-2012, estimate an eight to 10 percent increase and show the larger amount on your Financial Certification form and bank letter.

IF YOU ARE **ACCEPTED TO UNLV**

1. **If you are overseas, apply for a student visa.** The I-20 is issued upon your admission to UNLV. Once you receive it, you must use it to apply for your student visa at the nearest U.S. Consulate visa-issuing office.

To apply for your student visa, you need the following:

- An admission letter from UNLV
- A valid I-20 (Certificate of Eligibility) from UNLV
- A valid passport from your native country
- Financial support documents

If you are already in the U.S. in F-1 visa status, ask your current international student advisor to transfer your SEVIS record/I-20 to UNLV. Visit <http://www.travel.state.gov> for more information.

2. **Complete the New International Student 101 online orientation course.** All newly-admitted international students must complete this online course offered through the Office of International Students & Scholars prior to registering for classes.
