Who Should Complete This Application?

Complete this application if you are:

- Home-schooled
- Earning or have earned a GED
- Graduating or have graduated from high school
- Transferring credits from another university
- A student who has completed a bachelor's degree at UNLV and is applying to earn a second bachelor's degree.

If you require documents for F-1 student visa status, complete the international student application for admission, found at unlv.edu/admissions.

Deadlines

- **Scholarship Deadline:** To be eligible for all UNLV scholarships, you must submit your complete application for admission by Jan. 1, 2010.
- **Spring 2010 Deadline:** Jan. 1, 2010
- **Fall 2010 Deadline:** Aug. 16, 2010

Freshman Students *(with 0 to 23 transferable college credits)*

- **Admission Requirements:** Complete all core high school courses, including four years of English, three years of science (two must include a lab), three years of math, and three years of social science.
- Earn a weighted 3.0 GPA or higher in the core high school courses listed above.
- **OR** earn a combined score from the SAT critical reading and math sections of at least 1040 **OR** an ACT composite score of at least 22.
- **OR** earn a Nevada Advanced High School Diploma.
- Students with college credits must have earned an overall 2.5 or higher college GPA.
- **Application Materials:** Submit your official high school transcripts in a sealed envelope from the issuing institution. If a Clark County School District (CCSD) student identification number is provided on the application, we will make the first attempt in requesting official transcripts for students who attend or have attended public high schools in Clark County, Nev. Also, submit your ACT and/or SAT test scores. They may be used for admission if you do not meet the GPA requirement; however, they will be used for placement into your first-year English and math classes.

Transfer Students *(with 24 or more transferable college credits)*

- **Admission Requirements:** Earn a cumulative 2.5 GPA or higher in your college courses.

- **Application Materials:** Submit your official transcripts in a sealed envelope for all colleges/universities you have attended. If you have not taken first-year English and math classes, submit your ACT and/or SAT test scores.

General Instructions

- Visit unlv.edu/admissions and follow the instructions to complete the online application for undergraduate admission. If you would like to apply for graduate admission, please visit graduatecollege.unlv.edu.
- If you plan to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), include your Social Security number on this application.
- If you reside in Clark County, Nev., and participate in Upward Bound, Educational Talent Search, Adult Educational Services, or GEAR UP, your application fee will be waived. To have your fee waived, complete the online application and call 702-774-8658 when you have reached the "payment" section of the application.
- Fee waivers are only accepted if they are issued from UNLV.
- If you are unable to pay with a credit or debit card, complete the online application for admission and call 702-774-8658 when you are ready to submit your payment.

Nevada Residency *(for tuition purposes)*

Students who have graduated from a Nevada high school are considered residents of Nevada and are eligible for in-state tuition. If you do not meet this criteria, you may still be eligible for Nevada residency. Visit unlv.edu/admissions/residency to learn more.

Financial Aid and Scholarships

To be eligible for UNLV scholarships, you must submit your complete application by Jan. 1, 2010. This includes completing the online application for admission and submitting test scores, transcripts, etc.

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is available online after Jan. 1. We are continually accepting applications for financial aid. Visit finaid.unlv.edu/checklist for step-by-step instructions on how to apply for grants, loans, and work-study jobs. Priority consideration is given to those who apply early.

Next Steps

Once you have submitted your complete application, including the \$60 application fee and your official transcripts, we will process your application in four to six weeks. You will receive notification of the admission decision in the mail.

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Insight Resume

Responses should be limited to 100 words per question.

1. Describe examples of your leadership experience in which you significantly influenced others, helped resolve disputes, or contributed to group efforts over time. Consider responsibilities to initiatives taken in or out of school.

2. Describe any special interests and how you developed knowledge in these areas. Give examples of your creativity – the ability to see alternatives; take diverse perspectives; come up with many, varied or original ideas; or willingness to try new things.

3. Describe the most significant challenge you have faced and the steps you have taken to address this challenge. Include whether you turned to anyone in facing the challenge, the role the person played, and what you learned about yourself

4. Explain what you have done to make your community a better place to live. Give examples of specific projects in which you have been involved over time.

5. Describe your experiences facing or witnessing discrimination. Tell us how you responded and what you learned from these experiences and how they have prepared you to contribute to the UNLV community.

6. Articulate the goals you have established for yourself and your efforts to accomplish these. Give at least one specific example that demonstrates your work ethic/diligence.
